EDU 450	Special Methods: World Language	3	Only offered in Fall semester
Students who intend to teach a world language are required to spend at least one academic semester or a total of 15 weeks abroad studying the language for which they seek licensure. Although we suggest spending the entire time in one extended visit, students may combine visits to reach the total as long as one visit is a minimum of 8 weeks long. The program and projected plan of study should be approved by the student's academic advisor in the Department of World Languages prior to enrolling in a program.
